WILDLIFE CONSERVATION ACT 1950 AS AMENDED - SECTION 23F

PERMIT TO TAKE DECLARED RARE FLORA

The undermentioned person may take declared rare flora for the purpose described, subject to the terms and conditions of this permit.
Note: In this permit DRF = Declared Rare Flora.

3. DESCRIPTION OF PLANT
 - 3.1 SCIENTIFIC NAME: *Thelymitra stellata* and *Paracaleana dixonii*
 - 3.2 PARTS TO BE TAKEN: Above ground parts.
 - 3.3 QUANTITY: Permit covers inadvertent or incidental damage to up to 11 plants of *Thelymitra stellata* and 24 plants of *Paracaleana dixonii* (note condition 8.1).
4. PURPOSE OF TAKING: Implementation of the West Erregulla Exploration Program, including seismic survey and appraisal well drilling program.
5. METHOD OF TAKING: By machine (including raised roller mulching technique)
6. AREA TO WHICH PERMIT RELATES: Up to 70 hectares of clearing within the approved West Erregulla Exploration Program area (Exploration Permit 469).
7. PERIOD FOR WHICH PERMIT IS VALID: From the date of the signature below until 30 July 2015.
8. CONDITIONS:
 - 8.1 Warrego Energy Pty Ltd has committed to avoiding all known locations of DRF. With regard to 3.3 above, this permit does not cover the taking of DRF *per se*, but any inadvertent secondary impact to the DRF located within 15 meters of the disturbance footprint of the exploration operation.
 - 8.2 Warrego Energy Pty Ltd has committed to monitor the known locations of *Thelymitra stellata* and *Paracaleana dixonii* within 15 metres of the disturbance footprint annually between October and December for a minimum of two years from the completion of the project. The results of the DRF monitoring program must be provided to the Flora Administrative Officer, Species & Communities Branch annually one month after the completion of the monitoring.
 - 8.3 Hygiene measures, as committed to by Warrego Energy Pty Ltd in the Application, are to be undertaken when entering DRF habitat to minimise the risk of introduction or spread of weeds and disease.
 - 8.4 This permit also covers the activities of other persons involved in the above mentioned activities under the supervision of the permit holder.
 - 8.5 The location of DRF populations shall be treated as confidential and under no circumstances be disclosed to other persons, other than persons who may be undertaking activities in the vicinity of the DRF, without the written permission of the Director General, Department of Parks and Wildlife.
 - 8.6 A final report must be provided to the Flora Administrative Officer, Species & Communities Branch one month of the expiry of this permit, or the completion of the activities approved under this permit. This report should detail the number of DRF that were impacted during the works and the current status of the DRF population.
 - 8.7 The permit holder shall produce this permit whenever requested to do so by a Wildlife Officer, or by any person appointed by the body or authority which has the care or control of the land from where the DRF is taken. This permit must be produced with any other approval letters that may be in force during the period of this permit.
